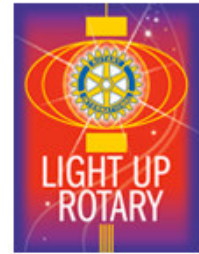

Thermus double insulated. \$45

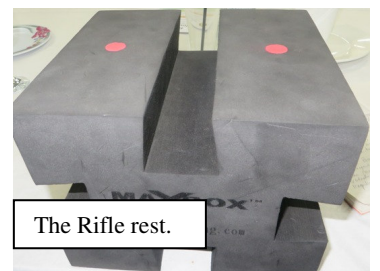
Pop up colander and bucket. These are great space saving items for the caravan or trailer.

A set of family dinner wear brought the very interesting display and presentation to an end.

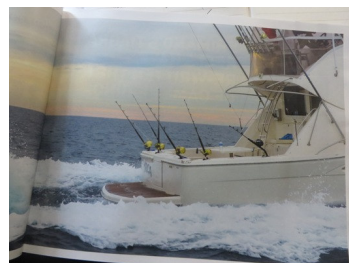
Beau is a local lad attended Primary School at Barrington and GHS for his senior years. He has a younger brother.



Beau at rest.



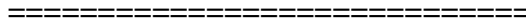
The Rifle rest.
