Lindy Dupree was introduced by PP Ashleigh. The notes below Lindy emailed to me, thank you.

Thanks for the introduction last night



After 40 years in the travel industry, I felt like I was out of the Ark but the memories are great not to mention being at the cutting edge of some major changes in travel
So quick précis

Arrived in Sydney from the UK on SS Orcades in 1949 as an infant

Dad was with Elizabeth Arden and brought same to Australia

Spent much of my early childhood travelling back and forth to Europe by sea with my parents Lived in Sydney and educated at SCEGGS Redlands

Worked in the design world, then persuaded to join Qantas in 1970 as a flight hostess, flying internationally for 3yrs

Reservations, fares and ticketing with Qantas as they cutover to computerised reservation systems

Transferred to Canada with Qantas – sales and marketing, selling Australia as a destination and for Qantas to win the business, saw me travelling the length and breadth of Canada

Returned to Australia in 1976 joining Air New Zealand in sales and marketing, based in Sydney

A break from travel saw me spend some time in Tamworth; whilst there Traveland approached me to start their first regional office in Australia (Tamworth was their first regional office)

2yrs later headhunted to work back in Sydney with World Aviation as Australian manager, general sales agent for TWA/Sabena/Gulf Air/Braniff/Air Lanka/Air Malta

Son James born in 1984, now 31 – a project manager based in Sydney and finishing his Masters degree at Newcastle University

Left World Aviation and headed up a travel company in Sydney who were the Australian agents for Europ Assist, one of the world's largest emergency assistance companies, used by most major travel insurance companies for their emergency work

1995 started my own travel company, World Marketing Travel & Tours, a full member and shareholder of Travelscene American Express – based in Balmain, Sydney

1996 became general sales agent in Australia for Seabourn Cruises and Peter Deilmann Cruises. Seabourn, a luxury cruise line, was bought by Carnival Cruise Lines, whilst Peter Deilmann, a German river cruise line, ceased their operation in 2010

1998 World Marketing was approached to become the Australian agent for Gullivers Sports Tours UK, the world's largest sports touring company, and we are still their agent, looking after their touring groups to Australia The company has evolved into a complete travel company handling corporate, leisure and special interest group travel

Husband James & I bought our farm in Wards River in 2000, and after a few years of regular weekend visits, working on our farm, the decision was made to relocate our travel business to Gloucester and move permanently 2006 World Marketing opened Travelscene Gloucester in Denison Street

Both James and I are avid readers, and with James' mum, Anne, a celebrated journalist and two times Walkely award winner, we missed not having a bookshop to visit

2007 The Gloucester Bookshop opened, staffed by wonderful Marion Corbett. Since gone from strength to

strength, with three Gloucester Writers Festivals in hand, we are keen to hold another festival in 2016, inviting writers from the Hunter and around Australia to attend

2012 bought our current premises at 76 Church Street to house our Travel Company and bookshop
