

#### Guest Speaker – Anna Burley

Anna was born in Gloucester and left in 1985 to study at Sydney Uni. She worked in finance with Westpac but decided that she wasn't adding anything to society so took an offered redundancy and studied Nursing and has worked in Northern Queensland for 10 years.

Her next career change has bought her back to Gloucester as CEO of the Bucketts Way Neighbourhood Centre. Some of Gloucester's demographics that are above the NSW state include 23% of our population is over 65 compared to 14.5% in the state; we have 4.5% Aboriginal or Torres Straight Islanders compared to the state's 2.5%; we have 6.7% disabled compared to 4.9% in the state. Gloucester's Social Index also shows us as moderately disadvantaged. Therefore there is a high need for services.

The Neighbourhood Centre started in 1989 with 14 hours a week and now has 50 paid staff, 60 voluteers and is governed by a 7 member Board one of which is Brian Dixon. They operate from 2 locations, Queen Street, opposite the Post Office and King Street, opposite the Council. Some of the services offered include:

Centerlink Agent, financial counceling, homework centre,legal advice, cooking classes, hampers & vacation activities.

Home & Community Services provide domestic help, home maintenance, shopping, transport. The Cottage provides day programs, social activities, transport and respite for the disabled and their families.

Transition to Work provides money to upskill students with developmental issues to help get them employment.

Training courses – RSA, White Card, Barrista, horticulture & retail programs.

Funding comes from Government grants both State and Federal. Problems are foreseen with the change to the National Disability Insurance Scheme where disabled individuals receive the money to fund services.

Future concerns include the need for a Social Worker, a Group Home for disabled as the closest is in Taree, Disaster planning especially for the aged and staff shortages if the new Aged Care centre opens.

Anna was introduced by Ashleigh and thanked with the customary glass by Vicki.
