Notes from meeting held at Gloucester Bowling club 1st December, 2015


Ashleigh will be doing the Bulletin for 3 months while Li is away and weekly as it suits her.

Jacqueline is part of Advanced Hearing Care. Thank you for inviting me to speak to your Club. She has been coming to Gloucester for 20 years and at the Medical Centre for 7 years.

She explained about the ear and its function and how to look after your hearing.

Like wearing ear muffs when using machinery and be aware of constant extended noise as this is what causes us to loose our hearing. Older persons are also likely to be deaf.

Some other reasons for hearing loss are born with it, due to illness or blocked with wax. When wax is dark it is old and very difficult to move from the ear canal. It has to be softened. Before it is removed syringing is not recommended now days as there are other methods to remove wax. Do not put anything in your ear larger than your elbow!

She answered many questions and checked out our ears.
