

Go online to check out the latest program and register. There is a late fee after Feb 15th and closing date is 1st March.



The Gloucester Project started in 2008 as a 'Not For Profit' company in response to the demise of traditional industries and high unemployment.



Research predicts this area will be climate advantaged during climate change with bigger dry events but also big dumps of rain.

The Tucker Patch is trying to introduce horticulture into the area through education, research, trials and as a TAFE outreach. Stage 1 of the project has been very successful – winning awards and grants.





Stage 2 – the business stage – is now beginning and needs to be profitable. For the future of the Tucker Patch and the Gloucester Food Hub, more volunteers and food growers are needed. Alan Edinbugh is the new head of this social business.

The Farm Gate is open 10am – 12.30 each Friday. Food boxes can be ordered online. Volunteers are always needed – 2 hours per week
