

110th Anniversary of Rotary International

February 23 - On this day in 1905, Rotary founder Paul Harris formed one of the world's first service organizations, the Rotary Club of Chicago, as a place where professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships. Since then, Rotary has continued its commitment to service by providing clean water, improving maternal health, awarding scholarships, fighting diseases, and improving lives around the world.

This year, also marks the 30th anniversary of the PolioPlus program. Since the fight to end polio began, 2 billion children have been immunized, 10 million children have been saved from lifelong paralysis and 125 countries have been declared polio-free. During the week of February 17 - 23, share with others how we are "this close" to ending polio and highlight Rotary's 110 years of service.

Guest Speakers - Libby Bleakley & **Teresa Beck**

Both are members of Rotary. Libby was in the NSW Police and Teresa in the Queensland Police. They both wanted to do international work so moved to the Federal Police 7 years ago, where the met and have worked together in East Timor.

Timor Leste gained independence 14 years ago. Dili is the most populated area but it has 70% unemployment. 66% are under 30 with a birth rate of 5.5 per family. 54% of children are malnourished and 73% of the population is below the poverty line. Domestic violence is a huge problem. The unemployed youth often get involved in gangs, which are now outlawed.

Some findings from East Timor are that the community is fearful of Police; young people like training and are then less likely to use drugs & alcohol; Communities with strong leaders are safer and education increases employment;

Therefore the Proposal Libby and Teresa came up with is to run a project like a PCYC to increase employment by education and teaching English and to reduce domestic violence and other crime.



They need \$300,000 to build 2 classrooms, gym equipment and a meeting area. They have raised \$35,000, have chosen the land and have community involvement.

The AFP have approved Libby and Teresa to fundraise and organize the project. The centre will be built in Cormoro an area of Dili with the worst crime rates.

In the future they would like to take back skilled persons to help in the community and train locals. The project has been registered by RAWCS.

Don thanked Libby and Teresa an example of 2 girls who have overcome obstacles and started raising money to help others.
