

Guest speaker – David Marston
It is possible to be self sufficient for energy by using wind, hydro, solar, methane pits,

geothermal, wave or tidal energies. In practice, though, we still rely on fossil fuels.

Some examples:

King Island – 60% self-sufficient using solar & wind. New Zealand gets 13% from geo thermal. Perth supplements energy with wave generation.

Germany plans to use 80% renewable energy by 2050. South Australia gets 23% of its energy from wind & solar.

For Gloucester to be self sufficient we would need 15 wind turbines and 30 hectares of solar.



In Australia, large renewable resources are from the population and away Government funded transmission lines have been built to link coal and hydro electricity plants. Possibly a privatized system may provide changes. Problems in moving towards renewables include State rivalries. government not building more lines as thinking of privatising, the huge lobby from the fossil fuel industry, social apathy in not needing to change and the economics of large investments needed in the short term for long term benefit.

David sees some possibilities for Australia with wind farms across mid Australia to use the 'roaring 40's'; solar in central Australia, hydro in all dams as well as the Snowy; some geothermal; wave energy in the west and east and tidal in northern areas. Australia could technically produce enough renewable energy now but possible economically by 2030 but we need a sizeable government backflip!
