

Guest Speaker - President Brian Beesley on Grant Presentation.

How to successfully apply for a Grant.

Brian handed out an information sheet and the notes were taken at 2 seminars he attended which were presented by the Grants Guy [Keith Whelan]

"A GRANT IS AN INVESTMENT- NOT A GIFT"

There were 44 headings and too much to print but some highlights follow which Bees noted.

- 1. **Ensure you know** why you need the Grant, How you will acquit the money.
- 2. Do you have the capacity to successfully complete the application?
- 3. Funding may be done in rounds (x4x2x1)
- 4. **Features to consider in an application.** Your application must stand out from the others. Good English-good grammar. Use "declare words" Will...Are" Don't copy & paste) from one grant to another. (Assessors may be external)
- 5. 30 words or less be brief. Use bullet points.
- 6. 12 million per annum in Grants Money available each year.
- 7. 666,000 benevolent societies and Not for Profit competing.
- 8. Rotary is trusted.
- 9. Financial partnerships are mad with reputable (organisation, Groups or Firms) Do your homework on the company you are about to partner with.
- 10. The lead application can be Rotary or ??? eg Gloucester Shire Council or a Deductible Gift Recipient –Tax Deductable can partner with who has the tax deduction.
- 11. Grants can profile your Club.
- 12. Be Pro-active. State the need clearly and up-front. Place the amount you require up-front.
- 13. Be prepared for 50/50 funding. (Club raises half to show commitment)
- 14. You (Gloucester Rotary will be googled) So a good professional up to date profile is essential.
- 15. Make sure you have the capacity to manage all facets of the Grant obligation.
- 16. Proof the grant application before sending.
- 17. Have a thank you letter with unique pictures.
- 18. Only have one point of contact.
- 19. Give professionally....receive professionally.
- 20. Grants are given to make a difference. Something has to happen with the money.

Moppy looked great. Road freshly graded. River running...Norm had the spit done and desert was 1st class. Thanks to Terry and Jill.


