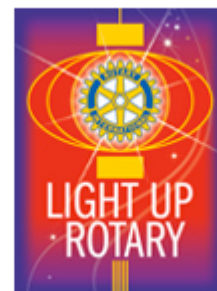

Rotary E-Club FAQ's.

Each week I will include some facts.

What is the Rotary International naming policy for Rotary e-clubs?

The Board of Directors of RI has mandated that the generic name is Rotary e-clubs. This requires "e-clubs" to be in lower case letters with a hyphen included as shown. The word Rotary must always precede the word "e-club. When referring to the name of a specific Rotary e-club, as named upon its charter document, the letter e must become upper case for example Rotary E-Club of District 3310. There has been some confusion about this RI naming protocol because it is inconsistent with the international standard which is e Trade, eHealth, eBanking, eSecurity, eCommerce, eClub etc. with no hyphen separating the e.
