

# 50 people attended this Energy Expo dinner and there was plenty of energy in the room.

President Brian had done a wonderful job of inviting so many people to this interesting evening. Not to mention the Expo at the Bowling Club before the meeting. Sergeant Raja Chris called order and he announced the 4 Way Test.

Bees gave us a great welcome and recognized all the guests. With wood fires and Solar Energy on display we knew it would be a great evening of information.

First we had **Jim** from Jindara wood heaters. [Jane Deen who manages **Home Hardware** invited Jim who is from Holland.]

Jim has been in the wood fire industry for a number of years and Jindara is a family owned business for 70 years. Australian Owned. They employ 170 full time staff. They have their factory outside Ballarat. Being the largest employer in there little town. The company has ensured quality over the years. They also manufacture for many companies.

Jindara Heaters are sold nationally – Home Hardware Jane Deen in Gloucester.

The mission with wood heaters has copped a lot of flack over the year.

Some country towns do not have wood fire heaters or they have restrictions on what heater to

install. This is due to emissions and the contaminants of smoke.

The industry is working to combat the problem and looking at Europe for ideas. He spoke about baffle plates that help give more heat, keeps emissions down and more holes in fire box makes the fire burn harder. [this is good]

Some Council's take old fire heaters back and give the customer \$800 to install gas and then the family realize the gas does not heat the house and then installs wood fire again.

Jim described the heaters. All apply to the Australian standards. They also manufacture gas log fires.

Heaters

### We had dinner of yummy Chinese food.

Next we had **Tony Watts** who is an electrician and works for Mackies. How Solar Sysptems work?

Solar panels work on light then the inverter on the wall delivers AC to DC house and to the grid.

Use watt power when the sun is out saving use of your own power. Sizing is critical as you do not want to give power back to the grid. You will always have a power bill.

Change the household habits to suit the solar system. Saving 35Kw per Solar system.

There is emerging stuff. Now battery storage during sunlight use and then use the battery for night lighting etc.

Solar Systems work very well for a businesses. Sun during the day and off at night. It is suggested that in 2 to 3 years the system has paid for itself. 9 to 5 business works well.

It is not just about Solar it is sustainability. Tony said fair dinkim saving cost look what is around the house to save money. E.g. An old fridge. Get rid of it. Chews power.

Ray Fitzgerald told us the panels he sells are made in Australia, AC panels. He explained

from a Fireman's perspective that solar panels on a house with DC panels wire from the panels go to the inverter and is still active even though the power has been turned off so fireman can enter the house to put out the fire. The AC system will turn all the power off. Ray spoke about many technical aspects of solar power. I suggest if you are interested contact Ray. He also showed a video of the factory making the panels in Adelaide. Most impressive I felt. There is full traceability of the product through bar codes.

Paul Mackie our last speaker spoke on a Hybrid Home his.

There is 6 Kw on the roof which will heat floor and also a storage system. {I think I missed a bit here] by putting the energy into the floor and having storage systems power houses will put up costs and homes not storing will pay more for their power.

A little about Mackies. Started in 1953 and Paul is 2<sup>nd</sup> generation. Well known in the area and a long association with people. He also knows some of our locals, Sam, Pete Markey and Bees.

Following all the speakers President Bees asked his wife Heather to present Rotary Glasses to Jane Deen, Tony Watts, Ray Fitzgerald and Paul Mackie. There were also guests from Mackies Scott Hadenham, Tony Watts and Mark Dreyer.

Some Rotary e-clubs use Go To Meeting, a Web-hosted service created and marketed by Citrix Online, a division of Citrix Systems. This is remote meetings and desktop sharing software that enables a member of a Rotary e-club to meet with other members, collaborate with fellow Rotarians in organizing and managing service projects, and attend meeting with other via the internet in real-time. Some other Rotary e-club use similar collaboration software for other vendors to facilitate their meeting in real-time.
