#### **GUEST SPEAKER - Don McLeod - RAWCS in District 9650**



Don gave us an informative list of the projects undertaken of the last 5 years by RAWCS.

The 7 major projects are:

- 1. Project Tafea, Tanna Is, Vanuatu emergency repairs to Lenakel Hospital after the cyclone followed by maintenance, repairs and replacement; developed community skills centres at Yarki village and Lenakel Hospital
- 2. Papua New Guinea Kokoda & Port Moresby Hospital renovations, distribution of excess school furniture to centres, construction of staff quarters and water tanks at Kokoda hospital, solar lighting on Kokoda trail, computer and sewing training on donated equipment
- 3. Solomon Islands Kiluufi Hospital, completion of Molotabi Health clinic
- 4. Timor Leste installation of solar lights, maintenance & training at Railco district school ( High school students involved in computer training)
- 5. Shelterbox/Disaster Aid -
- 6. NIAS Island Indonesia after the 2007 Tsunami construction of Hostell & Mini Medical centre
- 7. Mera School Nepal established school building & community greenhouse

#### The 8 secondary project areas are:

- 1. Adopt a School Student & teacher Resource kits developed and distributed
- 2. Donations in Kind surplus educational & medical equipment
- 3. FAIM liaison of all volunteer teams
- 4. Pacific Training Aid selection of personnel to undertake 'on the job training' mainly nurses
- 5. Rotarians against Malaria promotion of bed nets, alternative treatments & educational campaigns
- 6. Safe Sanitation & water Saves Lives water storage & reticulation facilities
- 7. Marketing –
- 8. Baby Kits distribution of kits of baby clothing which also encourages the mothers to visit the clinics

#### Funding

- 1. Projects may be self funded, club donations, Rotary Foundation Matching Grants, Aus Aid and others
- 2. District RAWCS funds are in a healthy position
- 3. In 2012/13 National RAWCS expenditure exceeded \$23million
