PREVIOUS MEETING – 29th October

Pete welcomed the guests and gave Anne a big thankyou for the blue, white and red table decorations for the French theme. After a lively fine session, he introduced the guest speaker, in what might have been French, our exchange student, Oceane.

Oceane's wonderful sense of humour showed throughout her talk and helped her deal with no connection for the Mac computer and the battery going flat on the borrowed PC which meant her photos couldn't be shown.

Oceane lives in the middle of France, in Bourges. It is 400km south of Paris and has a population of 66,300. Bourges has an 'old town' and is famous for its cathedral and the 5 day Le Printemps de Bourges festival. She lives 10 mins away, in a town of about 5000.





Her father is 51 and a policeman. Oceane thinks he's stubborn and says he likes to cook – experimentally! Her mother is 46 and a librarian. She is lovely & generous but doesn't like to admit when she's wrong. She has 2 older sisters. Elyse who is studying to be a French teacher in Australia, (therefore do we know of an opening?), and Justine who will also be a French teacher, but in France. According to Oceane, Justine has the much better sense of humour but is disorganised and as they share a bedroom, Oceane's half is also messy! She misses them all very much.

Oceane's school has 1700 students and has vocational and academic strands combined. She can't choose individual subjects only a strand. School is from 8am till 5 -6 pm. There is also lots of homework.

Her sports were gymnastics and horse riding but due to a back injury, these are now limited.

In France, English is taught in schools from 12 years old. Australian is definitely not like the English she learnt and this was a big surprise. She is enjoying the warm weather and the landscapes – mountains to beaches.
