Pat Cavanagh - Principal of GHS

Late last year GHS ran a 5 week pilot program of a Resilience for Leaning Hub. This was an offsite project for kids at risk of not completing their schooling.

The pilot was very successful and GHS now want to run this program for 35 weeks but need funding for rental of premises, which will be approximately \$2000 -\$3500. Pat is sending a formal letter to he Rotary Board members.

Pat's answers to a few questions:



- The Hub ran for 3 days a week and was staffed by a teacher and a teacher's aide
- Kids at risk of being suspended or expelled attended the Hub
- Students have an individual leaning plan to work at during the mornings
- Breakfast was supplied
- Afternoon sessions involved volunteer work at the Tucker Patch or at the Nursing Home
- Work experience or work placement occurred on the other 2 days of the week
- 6 students were involved in the pilot program
- parental involvement was expected
- along with attendance, self esteem also improved

Guest Speaker - Martyanto Young Rustandi - known as Young

Young owns the Gloucester Pharmacy. He is the 3rd child in a family of four and comes from Djakarta in Java, Indonesia.

He was born in 1986 and at 3 months of age went to West Papua by ship to live with other family. In his childhood in West Papua he drove his first car, smoked his first and last cigarette pipe, drank alcohol (as family owned a bar) and held a hand gun (as lived next to the Police Station). They moved back to Djakarta but moved out of the city when he was about 10 and he admitted that he was behaving rather badly!

In 1998, Indonesia was politically unsettled with many riots and the family moved to Malaysia and then to China a year later. Here he went to a public school for 2 years where he couldn't speak Chinese so liked maths, sports and English. He did Army training whilst in China and then they moved back to Indonesia where he finished high school.

Young came to Sydney at 19 and went to the International School. He wanted to be an architect but his brother told him to aim for marks to get into pharmacy as Li (his brother's wife's sister) had done. He got into Pharmacy at Sydney University, did his internship in Canberra and came to work in Gloucester for 1.5 years. He was offered the business. To buy, so asked Li to join him as a partner. The pharmacy allows him to help others and would eventually like to own more pharmacies.
