- He was approached by Doug Piper to trial for the Australian Deaf Rugby team and was successful in obtaining a trip to Japan. A knee injury on tour took many months to overcome and this weeks game against a Gloucester team was the first opportunity to test the cured knee and all went well.
- Wade spoke of the need to raise funds to enable his up coming tour of New Zealand.
   Fund raising is usually up to the players to organise.
- Gloucester Rotary was happy to assist with a donation.

We wish Wade well in his future games and generally in his career. It was a great story to see how adversity has been faced head on and with such success. An inspiration to us all!
