Gloucester 2015 'Unsung Hero' Community Service Award

NOMINATION GUIDELINES

Nomination:

The Rotary Club of Gloucester invites organisations or individuals to nominate candidates for the **2015** '*Unsung Hero*' Community Service Award who have made a significant contribution to our community over many years and whose service may have gone largely unrecognized in the past.

The successful awardee will receive a plaque at a ceremony to be held at a meeting of the Rotary Club of Gloucester in June 2016. In addition the winner will receive \$500 to be donated to a community service charity organisation of their choice.

Selection Criteria:

- 1. Person who has made a significant contribution over a period of years to the Gloucester community or a Community Service or Not-for-Profit Organisation based within the bounds of the Gloucester Shire.
- 2. Person who has NOT received a community service award or similar public recognition in the past 10 years for their contribution to our community.
- 3. Person who lives within the bounds of the Gloucester Shire.
- 4. Person is not a current member of the Rotary Club of Gloucester.

How to nominate:

Please fill in the enclosed nomination form and return in an envelope to, The Secretary Rotary Club of Gloucester PO Box 43 Gloucester NSW 2422

Attach evidence if desired of a support letter from a Referee who is able to comment with authority on the candidate's service.

Nominations must be received by 5 pm on Friday 29th April 2016. Late nominations will not be considered.
