Charles educated Rotarians and friends on the Alzheimer disease and Dementia. Alzheimer's Australia state and territory bodies have joined together to become one, single organization known as Dementia Australia, a unified, national peak body and charity for people, of all ages, living with all forms of dementia, their families and carers.

Our Form 4 students were joined by their families, academic and non-academic staff, international visitors and school leaders for the colourful celebration of our students' achievements. In true Tanzanian fashion, there was plenty of singing, dancing and entertaining speeches – a celebration to

remember!

Completing the final year of ordinary level studies (O Levels) is an impressive milestone in the life of any young adult. While 87% of Tanzanian students between the ages of seven and 13 are enrolled in primary school, only 32% of 14-19 year old students are enrolled in secondary school. By completing Form 4 Irene has achieved so much more than many others.

Your sponsorship of Irene's academic scholarship has made this achievement possible!


