

In addition to the financial aid of needy fellow citizens and the **gifted**, the Club support other local projects in Schweinfurt and the region such as

1. The Rotary Summer Course aims to give musically talented youngsters a chance to experience an intense week of diverse musical and artistic inspiration.



The Rotary Club Schweinfurt has enabled three talented and interested young people by taking a subsidy of \notin 600 each. With this contribution all costs were paid (accommodation, lessons, food).



2. The Rotary Club Schweinfurt supports pupils at three Schweinfurt City Schools in designing a healthy breakfast and sandwiches. In this unique project students of the Albert Schweitzer Secondary School, the Rückert Primary School and the Pestalozzi School learn and deepen the aspects of a healthy diet in a playful and child-oriented way. Conclusion: Healthy nutrition makes sense, is fun and also tastes good.

Rotarian Jade Spencer spent an afternoon with the Interactors to do a "SWOT" analysis (Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities, Threat).


Interactors were able to discuss about their latest project 'Night Out For Drought' with the view of planning for their next project.
