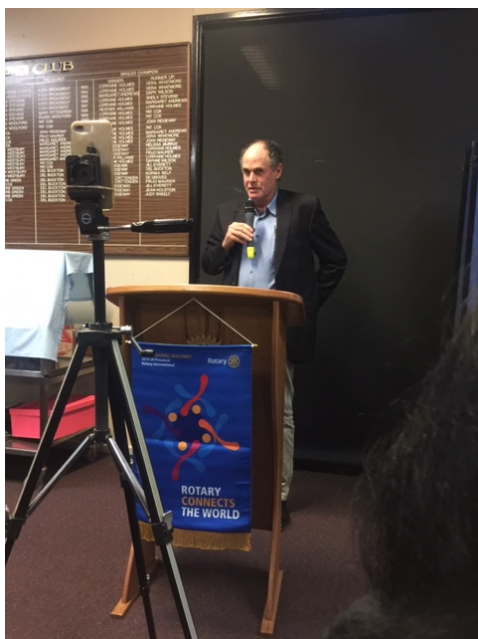

And now for something Completely different...

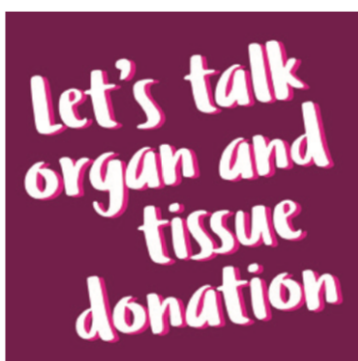


Here is a great picture of Graham Forbes & Rotarians Brian, Tara and Greg.

Graham's family moved to the area in 1905!! (when Forbesdale was almost called Pigsty) The Forbes' farm is currently home to 800 cows, 15 employees and produces 6 million litres of milk/ year.

Graham gave us a run down of the "then and now" of the dairy industry in the area. Back in the 1950's/60's there were roughly 400 dairy farms in Gloucester, while currently there are only about 14 - but these 14 farms are producing roughly the same amount now as the 400 farms did 60 years ago.

Graham's talk was very interesting and very informative. Thank you Graham and Cathy for coming to spend the evening with us.
