What a meeting we had last week!! A huge thank you to Mr Terry Snow and his new trainer Mary for joining us last week. For those who didn't get to read the Facebook post, please find it below.

Tuesday, February 19, Gloucester Rotary was honoured to host An Evening with Terry Snow, businessman, philanthropist, grandad and entrepreneur.

Terry shared with us a brief story of how he got to where he is today, citing his father as his biggest teacher and how the redevelopment of 1920's era buildings was the first major project that set him on his current path.

He saw an opportunity to redevelop Canberra airport during the John Howard era when the right set of circumstances lead to the purchase of the land and buildings. Turning the airport from an elaborate tin shed into a functional, well-designed airport and business park took vision. Today the airport can handle up to 9 million people a year, and has been labelled "the best small airport in the world."

Turning his efforts away from property development of one kind and onto another, Terry began to dream of building Willinga Park, a purpose-built equestrian centre located south of Canberra. Housing 230 stables, 20 cabins and growing every day, Willinga Park is set to be the best equestrian centre in Australia. Focusing on Campdraft and developing animal and athlete partnerships to make Australia and Willinga Park a contender on the international equestrian scene.





Terry left some parting words for the Gloucester High School attendees;

"Most adults are very keen to talk to you. You would think 'why would they talk to me?' Don't think like that. If you want to know what's going on, ring someone up. Your father might know someone or your mother, or school teacher, and don't be frightened to have a go. It doesn't matter where you start in life, it's not going to be where you finish. Don't forget the job. Get the experience, have a look around, say 'I don't like this,' or 'I do like that,' or 'I'm going somewhere else.'

a few things. I was very lucky to have a father, so I got out of the block pretty quickly. You people might not have had a father that took an interest in you or might not be in business and it might not have occurred to him to show you how to use balance sheets. I noticed a few young fellas who want to go into IT. Get into IT, you might make a goose of yourself, you're only a kid, and if you're worried about making a goose of yourself, give em your mates name. But don't hold back. Get into the river. It's like going to the swimming pool, you're dancing around the edge of the pool, jump in!"



His words of wisdom, sense of humour and jovial, approachable personality were a delight to have experienced here in our corner of the world.
