Tara & Greg Charles presented their "This is Our Life". Tara spoke to us about the slave labour she endured in the family business, only being paid in magazines and experience. Something that she said has shaped her. Tara has been involved with Rotary in many different aspects over the years, including taking a year to be a part of Rotary Youth Exchange in Austria/Germany. This experience taught her to be tolerant of others and hopefully taught those around her, the same.

After her return to Australia Tara started studying at uni, and found her place in Public Relations. She has been able to work in many industries, including tourism, education and mining & energy. After transferring from Newcastle down to Sydney, Tara found her place with Transgrid and in charge of a team of about 7-17 people.

She met Greg at a Lovedale Long Lunch, it took a few months for them to reconnect again after first meeting and now they have a beautiful, growing family.

Greg was born in Adelaide, to "ten pound poms" in the 70's, an only child, and relocated back to the UK. Greg was all set to follow in the family footsteps in Engineering. He gained qualifications in Aeronautical Engineering, among others. Greg loves adventures and camping and as a child was part of Scouts.

After uni, Greg had the opportunity to move to Cardiff, and became a graduate trainee in a consultancy company. During his time with this company, he worked his way up and through the ranks of many different positions. As Greg grew as an employee, so too did the company, and went from 13 employees to 60. He then moved on to become a Project Manager. He moved on from that job to working with Mars Chocolates in London, he enjoyed the job and the free chocolates that went with the position, which was the Global Program and Training manager, world wide.

Between jobs Greg travelled around the world reaching Australia and South Africa, where he accidentally stayed for 6 months. He drove all over South Africa with the timber



industry. Greg really loved his time in South Africa. He said that Australia and South Africa are the places where he feels most at home. In Australia, there is a "get on with the job" kind of attitude, where you can wind down with the beach and other such things, where as in South Africa, there is a lot of poverty. Within the poverty, you will find a lot of happiness and people with big smiles on their faces, as long as they have some food to eat and somewhere to lay their head, they seem happy.

He set up his own company after being made redundant with the chocolate company. But he landed a job in Sydney instead. Unfortunately that job fell though.

For the last 5 years Greg has worked as a contractor in Business and IT Project Management. He started out in the Property Development industry and moved on to such companies as News Limited and IAG. He also worked with software development companies.

Greg was adamant that he was not going to get involved with anyone before he's been in Australia for 12 months, and 51 weeks to the day, he meant Tara. Which he is very grateful for.

It wasn't all smooth sailing. The beginning of their relationship was long distance for a year, and as Tara's work brought her to Sydney, Gregs work took him to Canberra for a year, leaving Tara in Sydney alone. He now works for The Entourage, which is a small consultancy firm that specialises in Education and Training for Entrepreneurs and Business Owners. He is currently the Director of Operations.


