Jodie House: This is your life...



What a speech Jodie gave on her life. Getting over her nerves she told us about her early life of growing up in Turramurra, Terralgah, and Gloucester with her family. Whilst in Gloucester Jodie attended Saint Josephs Primary School and Gloucester High School. She participated in the State Choir which saw her perform at both the Opera House and the Sydney Para Olympic Games. When it was time for Uni, she went to UNE - Armidale, studying a Bachelor of science, and then a Double Major in Evolution & Forensic Anthropology and ended up getting her Teaching Degree. During Jodies Uni years, she actually discovered her interest in Medicine and

Essential Oils after her family experienced a medical set-back.

In 1999, at 23 years old Jodie was accepted to her first teaching position in Tennant Creek, at their high school, teaching maths & science. Tennant Creek threw many challenges her way, but this is where she got to work with remote communities where she encouraged young people to pursue their education.

When she got the call to come home for family reasons, back in those days, it took 2 days travel to get here. She then started work at Chatham High School.

This is where Jodie met paramedics who talked about the work they do, and really sparked her interest in the NSW Ambulance Service.

Walgett was Jodie's first placement after probation. This is where she met a quiet English backpacker who wasn't staying in Australia for very much longer. 4 years later, they were married and in a weeks time, their son will be 5 years old (Happy Birthday Bass).

After Walgett Jodie moved to Narramine to be in charge of the Narramine-Broken Hill region, where she spent a lot of time travelling. So when the opportunity to move to Tuncurry popped up. In 2007 Jodie and her husband moved to Gloucester.

During her years as a paramedic Jodie has had many experiences, both heart breaking and sometimes funny. She has had many opportunities to pursue different avenues in the field of Paramedics, including being trained in Counter Terrorism & Disaster Management. Some of the low lights of her career include receiving victims of the Bali Bombings back in Australia for treatment, while some of the high lights include delivering a baby on December 25th, which the parents refused to name the child Jesus. She has been chased

from houses by a variety of animals, such as dogs, pigs and geese.

Jodie is involved in many different committees within our community. She says she wants to help out the forgotten people in the community. Jodie finds the service both challenging and rewarding and lives by the words "You make your choices but your choices make you."
