Guest Speaker: John Ebbott (Care Flight)







President Ernie introduced John. John joined Care Flight in June 2008. John has many years experience in Information Technology and Technical Sales, however more importantly for his Care Flight role he has over 35 years of experience in Community Service, fundraising and running major community events.

John is an active member of the Rural Fire Service and the Lions Club if Crestwood. John is married to Kathy, and they have 2 adult sons, one of whom is married and a granddaughter and grandson.

John's involvement in the Care Flight team does not include operational missions but e has experience in Care Flight "special operations" having flown in as Santa at the last ten Care Flight kids Christmas parties.

CareFlo

Care Flight's service to regional New South Wales enters a new era as they commence a major long-term collaboration with the NSW Health Ministry.



Care Flight is a lead provider in a new service to fly patients needing specialist procedures or care only available at major tertiary hospitals, to and from their local hospitals.

These patients are not able to travel independently and required the specialist care of a trained flight nurse aboard a purposequipped medical aircraft.

The aircraft are based at Bankstown and Newcastle and supported by a fleet of custom-fitted patient transport vehicles. Additional vehicles drivers and nurses are located at Port

Macquarie, Coffs Harbour, Tamworth and Armidale, to support those centres and surrounding districts.

Meeting closed with Assistant Sergeant Pete leading a fine session and raffles.




