<u>Brian and Greg (Charles)</u> announced that Tara & Greg are expecting their second child. Congratulations Greg & Tara.



It was after the formalities, John Feehan presented us with some great information about the benefits of Dung Beetles and how they are an integral part of agricultural life. Mr Feehan is an incredibly passionate and dedicated man, with a career that









Some quick facts he dropped on us:

- ■28 million cattle are in Australia
- 300 million cowpats are produced
- ■1/2 million tonne of cow dung is dropped per day
- •Australia is losing 100mm of top soil every year
- ■80% of nitrogen produced goes into the atmosphere
- Leaving the dung to sit on the ground breeds flies
- There are 320 Australian Dung Beetle species
- There are 44 intruded species have been released (to deal with the cows and sheep)
- 30 introduced species have been established
- ■Cows only remove 60% of nutrients from grass, the other 40% is evacuated
- Bush flies spread Pink eye
- Treating Buffalo Fly costs us \$1billion per year
- Buffalo Flies are blood-sucking
- 1000's of buffalo fly can be on one beast.
- The holes and tunnels created by Dung Beetles assists in filtrating water and spreading nutrients deeper into the ground
- Dung Beetles create nutrient rich top soil
- Moxidectin is the best drench to use for Dung Beetle survival.

It was a thoroughly interesting night and we thank John Feehan for coming to talk to the Gloucester Community.
